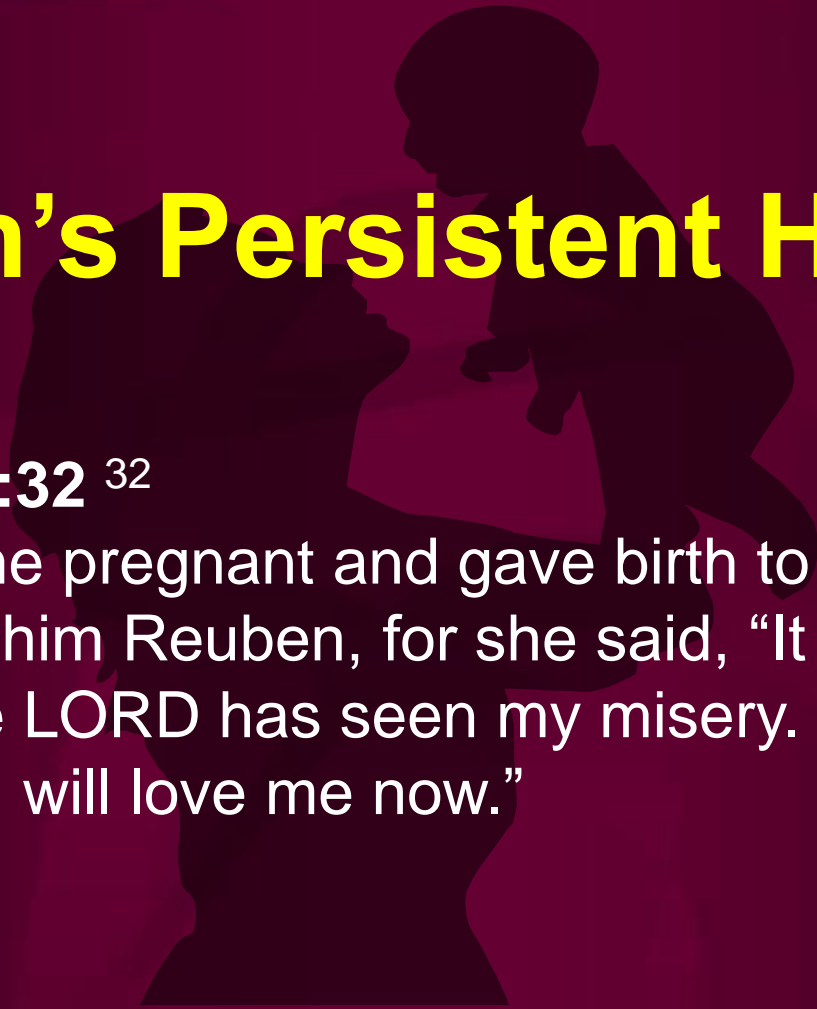


LEAH = THE UNWANTED MOTHER

2. Leah's Persistent Hope.

Genesis 29:32 ³²

Leah became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She named him Reuben, for she said, "It is because the LORD has seen my misery. Surely my husband will love me now."

3. Leah's Perpetual reward.

Genesis 29:35

35 She conceived again, and when she gave birth to a son she said, "This time I will praise the LORD." So she named him Judah. Then she stopped having children.

Genesis 49:31³¹ There Abraham and his wife Sarah were buried, there Isaac and his wife Rebekah were buried, and there I buried Leah.
